**MOTION:** By Chrissy Vinsko, second by Rose Hendrickson to approve the agenda. All were in favor, Motion carried.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** Chad Tuttle was in attendance representing the Fire Department and presented a letter to council with concerns of the building on Willow Ave/Main St. The Fire Dept. is concerned of the building collapsing onto Main Street and feels there needs to be safety protocols put in place and/or have the building taken down. Council agreed to look into this and will communicate with the Fire Dept.

Most of the public were in attendance to get an update on the police department discussion and Mayor Kevin McKee updated everyone and stated advertisements were placed for the part time police position and the borough is still in negotiations with Lanesboro and would probably take a few months. Discussions held on the pro vs. cons of police contracting vs. getting new police and the public voiced disagreements how the situation was being handled.

DPW & Codes reports reviewed. It was discussed whether to turn the Franklin Avenue property over to NEIC for the code violations. It was stated that there was a possibility that the occupants have moved out.

There were discussions about upcoming street improvement projects. Kevin explained that he had some quotes on the paving on Jackson Avenue. From Grand Street up it would be approx. \$114,000.00 and from Columbus Ave. up it would be approx. \$64,000.00. It was agreed for now to have some of it completed.
